The averments have claims of the deceptive similarities of the product with the well-known product Harpic of Reckitt Benckiser's. The claims of similar pattern, copy of shape as well as trade dress, labelling style etc. have been made with that of misleading advertisement. Pataniali's advert avers that one product is having "zero HCL" and other has "low HCL". Objections raised are basically centered on the fact that the advertisement by Patanjali is a mockery of Harpic's advertisement where a celebrity walks into the house of the person to inspect the toilet and the same has been taken as an offence by Reckitt Benckiser who has launched a full - fledged litigation against Patanjali. It would be interesting to witness the adjudication when the reputation of product/ company/ brands is evaluated in lieu of their marketing strategies.
