Micro blogging platform Twitter has come out with a new policy that includes deepfake videos which have been edited using artificial intelligence or other advanced software to distort a person's appearance or speech while appearing to be authentic, as well as other kinds of edited photos and videos that have been "substantially edited". This policy allows Twitter to start labeling, and in some cases, removing doctored or manipulated media that users share on its platform. However, in other cases, where the content might impact public safety or cause serious harm, the video or photo would likely be removed. At the outset, if the media is being shared in a deceptive manner and then it will be evaluated with respect to the potential for harm.

ALL MED DEVICES 'DRUGS' W.E.F. 1 APRIL

Central government notified all medical devices as 'drugs', effective from April 1, bringing a range of products from instruments to implants to even software intended for medical use in human beings or animals under the purview of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940. The expansion of scope of the statute shall not only facilitate price fixations but also make companies liable for violations in a penal manner. The notification under which these changes have been introduced will also recategorize medical devices that are used for life support, diagnosis, treatment or alleviation of any disease or disability, and disinfect other medical devices and other low - risk devices and high - risk devices. CDSCO regulations should be enforced and implemented by the authorities effectively now.





In an interim order, passed by Justice Pratibha M Singh of the Delhi High Court has directed a private Company to pay Rs. 1.2 lakhs to a woman, whose services were terminated on grounds of raising allegations of sexual harassment. This woman filed a writ petition seeking action against the employer for violation of the SHW Act and absence of an Internal Complaints Committee seekina а compensation of Rs 1 crore on account of grievous injury and irreparable damage done to her physically and psychologically.

The Government will set up ultra-mega renewable energy parks of a total of 50 gigawatt (GW) in Gujarat and Rajasthan in what could be the world's largest renewable energy investment programme. The land for this will be made available so that solar, wind and wind hybrid plants can be set up. The power ministry will be requested to strengthen transmission to these locations within 24 months for evacuation of power from these parks.

NO HC RELIEF FOR DISQUALIFIED DIRECTORS

The Bombay high court has in an interim order declined to stay a 2017 circular issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs and granted no relief to directors of various companies against disqualification due to failure in filing of returns. Therefore, if such financial statements or annual returns for any continuous period of three financial years have not been filed, then the action is triggered.
