



DEFAMATION CASES JURISDICTION



IPR POLICY - PRO PUBLIC OR DETERRING INDIVIDUAL INNOVATORS

The government while promulgating the National Intellectual Property Policy stated that the same shall ensure that the life-saving drugs are not monopolized under Patent laws and their affordability shall not be affected. Further, trademark registration process shall be expedited.

On the contrary, in the practical realm the new IPR policy is very vague and lacks clarity. The policy is apparently to please and facilitate expedited examination and other benefits for the multinational companies alone who can afford such high fees for meeting the pre requisites. Further, still there is no onus on the government officials nor timelines have been fixed for them to work but only on the Patent attorneys or applicants to complete work within reduced time limits. This policy lacks the main objective of encouraging innovation as interest of the individuals and small enterprises are not catered to in any manner whatsoever.

We shall witness the implementation of this policy and hope that with more amendments it becomes expeditious and also cogent.

POWER FROM SEA

Scientists in Japan have used sunlight to efficiently turn seawater into hydrogen peroxide, which can then be used in fuel cells to generate electricity. In a first of its kind experiment, the researchers have developed a new photo electrochemical cell, which is basically a solar cell that produces H₂O₂. The system has a total solar-to-electricity efficiency of 0.28%. This development would open up new

avenues for power generation using solar energy which is again a natural resource and available in abundance.

ANTI TRAFFICKING LAW NEEDS STATUTORY LEGISLATION

Central government is working on the draft bill against the heinous offence of trafficking. There is a need for stricter laws and its implementation so as to safeguard the interests and lives of the younger generation and women and children at large. The bill shall aim at creation of special court which handles issues of exploitation, sexual exploitation as well as forced labour. Presently there are quite a few laws including the Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, sections of the Indian Penal Code, the prohibition of Child Marriage Act and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, but they are inadequate as a comprehensive legislation is the need of the hour. It is pertinent that all aspects concerning both the victims, witnesses as well as accused is be promulgated in the legislation. The law might be respite for victims, witnesses as per legal experts.
