FOREIGN LISTING DIRECT **FOR** UNLISTED COMPANIES Ref: livemint.com, Wednesday, 01.11.2023



Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) has recently allowed certain unlisted companies to directly list on a foreign stock exchange with effect from 30th October. This provision has been introduced in Companies Amendment Act, 2020. This would open the doors to list certain classes of Indian public companies, which would be notified by the MCA, in permitted foreign jurisdictions starting with the International Finance Service Centre (IFSC) in Gift City, Gujarat. MCA now has to notify the class of securities, which the public companies would be allowed to issue, along with the foreign jurisdictions and the class of public companies.

DISPLAY SAMSUNG FILES COMPLAINT ALLEGING TRADE SECRET LEAK

A complaint has been filed by South Korea's Samsung Display against China's BOE Technology Group to the United States International Trade Commission about BOE misappropriating Samsung's trade secrets. BOE has been alleged to have violated a U.S. law covering "unfair methods of competition" including infringement of intellectual property such as trade secrets, in the field of organic light-emitting diode (OLED) display modules and components.

The university administration has envisioned the importance of IPR in academia and initiated several innovative academic programmes establishing Centre for IPR and teaching IPR as a mandatory value added credit course to about 10,000 students at UG and PG level and launching university IP policy.

TWO NEW PLANT SPECIES ON THE WESTERN GHATS Ref: thehindu.com, Friday, 17.11.2023



A team of scientists from the Botanical Survey of India (BSI) have reported the discovery of two new plant species from the evergreen forest patches in the southern end of the Western Ghats. The new species Musseanda Conferta was discovered in rocky areas of Kanykumari Wildlife Sanctuary and is related to Musseanda Hirutisima family. It prefers the vicinity of rocks in high-altitude grassland ecosystems. It has attractive flowers, and the ornamental potential of this plant can be explored to a great extent. Rungi Longistachya on the other hand, belongs to the family of Acanthaceae. It was discovered in the moist places of Anamalai Region near Idukki dam site in Kerala. The plant is a herb and grows on margins of evergreen forests. This plant has a distinct, narrow, long-spike with a long slender peduncle and light pinkish-white flowers.

EUIPO has launched a new GI hub which offers a central location to access information and learning materials for professionals engaged with or interested in the possibility of IP protection through Geographical Indications. It also offers users access to tools which can be used to explore the database of existing GIs. Further, it provides access to news and webinars on the topics of GIs and CIs to keep users up to date on the latest developments in this area and build confidence when engaging with the process of protecting their IP. A wide range of FAQs too are available to help business owners and product developers establish if GI/CI protection is the right path for them to take.

SAFFRON OF KISHTWAR DISTRICT RECEIVES GI TAG

The Saffron of the mountainous Kishtwar district, in Jammu & Kashmir, which is cultivated and harvested in the higher reaches, has been given the Geographical Indication (GI) tag by the Geographical Indications Registry. The spice is grown in some parts of the Kishtwar region of Jammu, along with parts

HUAWEI AND SHARP SIGN PATENT CROSS-LICENSING AGREEMENT Ref: Huawei.com, Monday, 27.11.2023



Huawei and Sharp have announced signing of a long-term patent cross-licensing agreement, which covers Cellular Standard Essential Patents, including 4G and 5G. The license represents mutual recognition of intellectual property of two standard contributors, which promotes standardization collaboration. Advanced technical standards enhance user experience, promote competition and reduce device and service cost. This global patent cross-licensing agreement with Huawei has been made under fair, reasonable, and nondiscriminatory conditions. This agreement reflects that both parties respect the high value of each intellectual property.

INTERIM RELEIF TO SUN PHARMA IN "ABZORB" TRADEMARK CASE Ref: livemint.com, Tuesday, 28.11.2023



Delhi High Court in the case titled, Sun Pharmaceutical Industries Ltd. v. Protriton Products LLP, 2023 SCC OnLine Del 7467 has

held that prime facie, defendants' mark ABBZORB was deceptively similar to plaintiff's mark ABZORB, even if mark ABBZORB was seen as a device mark, rather than a word mark. The Court restrained defendants from manufacturing, selling, offering for sale, advertising, directly or indirectly dealing dietary/health in supplements, nutraceuticals, apple cider vinegar and promotional material such as tshirt, shaker, bags, face mask or any other under the marks ABBZORB. ABBZORB NUTRITION, and or any other trade mark as might be deceptively similar to plaintiff's trade mark ABZORB. The Court opined that the aspect of infringement had to be determined. under Section 29 of the Trademarks Act. mark-to-mark on а comparison and if, mark compared to mark, there was likelihood of confusion or deception, or a presumption of association, there was infringement. The Court also opined that "the possibility of likelihood of confusion had to be assessed from the consumer's point of view of average intelligence and imperfect recollection who seeks the marks at different points of time. The test had to be applied at the initial interest stage, meaning, when defendant's mark was initially seen by the consumer and if, on viewing it, he, having earlier seen plaintiff's mark, was placed in a state of wonderment as to whether the two marks were the same, or associated, there was infringement".
